This Monday, the 15<sup>th</sup> of August, is the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will have Mass at 6PM on Monday in honor of this feast. Please come and celebrate the Assumption of Mary!

As I mentioned last week the celebration of this Mass will be a little different from what you are accustomed to in our church. I will celebrate this Mass according to the ancient custom of facing the same direction as the people while at the altar. This is not to “turn my back” to the people as many often erroneously say, but rather to turn my face, with the congregation, towards the Lord. This will be done according to the rubrics of the Mass in the Roman Missal (the book from which Mass is celebrated).

In the Roman Missal the priest is directed when to face the people and/or the altar. For example, after the bread and wine are brought to the altar and the priest washes his hands, the Missal says “Standing at the middle of the altar, **facing the people**, extending and then joining his hands, he says ‘Pray brethren...’ and then the priest is directed to pray the prayer with his hands extended over the gifts, which are on the altar. From that time I will face the altar until the Missal directs me again to face the people which is at the sign of peace: “The Priest, **turned towards the people**, extending and then joining his hands, adds: ‘The peace of the Lord be with you always...’” Finally the priest again is directed to turn towards the people and back to the altar at the “Behold the Lamb of God”: “The Priest genuflects, takes the host and, holding it slightly raised above the paten or above the chalice, **while facing the people**, says aloud ‘Behold...’” After the response “Lord, I am not worthy...” the priest is again directed “The Priest, **facing the altar**, says quietly... And he reverently consumes the Body of Christ.” Notice that the Missal assumes that the priest is not already facing the people at certain times of the Mass and explicitly tells the priest to face the altar at other times.

As Cardinal Sarah, head liturgist of the Church has recently said, the practice of the priest turning with the people in a common orientation to the Lord who comes, in those parts of the liturgical rites when we are addressing God “is permitted by current liturgical legislation. It is perfectly legitimate in the modern

rite.” This is an ancient custom that has been done throughout the history of the Church. It is something not only still permitted, but encouraged by legitimate liturgical authority, and is done by priests, bishops, and cardinals throughout the world. Pope Francis has also celebrated Mass in this way on more than one occasion.

When we celebrate the Assumption of Mary we are rejoicing because she has been raised up and above our created world into the presence of her Divine Son in heaven. Let us then celebrate this feast by ourselves looking, symbolically, beyond ourselves and together turn towards the Tabernacle (dwelling place) of God where we long to join Mary after this life.
