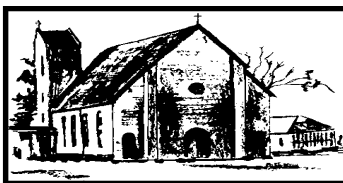

FATHER

Father! To God himself we cannot give a holier name.

Happy Father's Day! Fathers are called to servant leadership. One of the most disturbing developments of the past century is the erosion of authentic masculine authority of husbands and fathers. The relationship children have with their fathers can have a great impact on the relationship they have with God. It is no little thing that when we relate to God as our Father this assumes we know what a good father is. When our image of fatherhood is skewed, so can be our image of God.

It is appropriate that, just as Mother's Day falls in the month of Mary, that Father's Day falls in the month of the Sacred Heart. There is no better example of authentic masculine love than Jesus. He shows us that masculinity is not the "machismo" that demands to be served as a master. Rather, the heart of a man is one that is willing to make sacrifice in order to provide for those whom he is responsible. While fathers are responsible for providing materially by working, this cannot be considered enough. His responsibility comes with the authority to demonstrate justice and mercy. In justice a father teaches us to accept consequences for right and wrong. In his mercy a father teaches love without limit and without expectations of perfection. When either the responsibility or authority is neglected (by him or by others) the man becomes a tyrant and/or emasculated.

The better our fathers do at living out their role, the better chance our families have at living faithfully for God. St. Pope John XXIII wrote: "Within the family, the father stands in God's place. He must lead and guide the rest by his authority and the example of his good life."

Dear fathers, happy Father's Day to you! Remember that you are called to be a leader and a servant. You make sacrifice not just with your time and body through work, but more importantly through your heart by being an image of God's love in your household. Look to the Sacred Heart of Jesus which is permanently marked with the scar of its piercing. By being sacrificed and pierced He gave life to the Church, sanctifying her for God the Father. You

are called to do the same with your heart; not a heart of stone and not a heart of cowardice, but a heart of service, sacrifice, love, justice, and mercy.
