Last weekend our nation witnessed the worst mass shooting ever and the most deadly terrorist attack since 9/11. Every Christian person should pray for the repose of the soul of those victims who died, and the physical, mental, and spiritual healing of those who survived. No matter the motive of the killer, this was a deplorable act of hatred. No person of good will, and certainly no Christian, should take lightly how sad this situation is, nor be left without remorse.

This atrocity shows us yet again the dangerous nature of radical Islam. As Catholics we have the firm belief that all people of every race, sex, or creed are to be respected and loved. But this does not mean we cannot acknowledge that radical Islam is our enemy. We should work and pray for its end.

Unfortunately some people will use this event as an excuse to accuse Christians of hatred. It should be clearly understood that while we as Catholics consider homosexual acts to be immoral and unnatural, and homosexuality to be disordered, we do not hate those who struggle with this cross. We are required as Christians to love every human person and to respect their human dignity. We wish to show compassion to all people and as a Church to support anyone who wishes to overcome their personal struggles and fight temptation to sin. Radical Christianity, unlike radical Islam, is incompatible with hatred and violence. If one wanted an image of radical Christianity, they need look no further than Blessed Mother Theresa or St. John Paul II.

This situation brings to mind an urgent need that every person should see to: the good state of their soul. This sad case should be a reminder that our lives are fragile and it is impossible to ever know when we will die. In addition to unexpected natural and/or accidental causes of death, today we also must consider the possibility of violence. Death can strike at any moment of any day. Is your soul prepared, right now, for death and judgment? Have you repented of serious sins in your life (including gone to sacramental

confession and received absolution)? Have you put off rectifying a sinful aspect or attachment in your life? Now, and every moment, is the time to remedy these problems, because the very next moment may be too late.

Go to confession, and join me in offering prayers for the fallen and their families, and prayers for the defeat of terrorists and confusion to our enemies. Our Lady of Victory, pray for us.
