
Reconciliation: Tues. 5:30 PM & Sat. 3:00 PM

In Christ,

Happy Mardi Gras! Ever since I was a small child I have loved going to Mardi Gras parades, eating King Cake, and listening to the marching bands. I've come to love not only the south Louisiana cultural expression of this celebration, but the deeper meaning it has in relation to our prayer life.

As you likely know already, Mardi Gras ("Fat Tuesday") gets its name from the idea of eating all the sweets and more luscious foods before the fast of Lent starts on Ash Wednesday. In the Church the day was once commonly known as "Shrove Tuesday." The word *shrove* is the past tense of the English verb *shrive*, which means to obtain absolution for one's sins by way of Confession and doing penance. Both *Mardi Gras* and *Shrove Tuesday* emphasize what is about to happen, the beginning of the season of Lent.

Mardi Gras and Lent are so closely connected that if one does not know the connection, the meaning of Mardi Gras is lost. It becomes just another festival. Unfortunately that has happened for many people. But it is important for faithful Catholics and Protestants alike to know the connection and celebrate it properly. There is no sin in enjoying ourselves, taking part in the revelry, catching beads, and having good food. But if these things are done without purpose they *can* spiral into sinful behavior. I do not have to mention the types of gluttony and behavior that are linked to Mardi Gras today. This spiral happens when we forget that ultimately this festivity is in place so that we can prepare for something, not gorge senselessly.

What are we preparing for and what good does this type of prep do? As I mentioned already we are preparing for the season of Lent. On Wednesday Catholics around the world will receive their blessed ashes and be reminded of their mortality. It is through our mortality that Christ has brought us salvation when He entered into it Himself. We celebrate on Mardi Gras because we are still alive and have the God given freedom to enjoy the pleasures of life. On Wednesday we are also reminded that this freedom is not primarily for this pleasure, but for the ability to freely live lives united to the emptying out of Christ on the Cross. God wants us to live free from the slavery of sin: whether in the pleasures of Mardi Gras or the fasting of Lent.

Please join me in enjoying the festivities of Mardi Gras. Do so with every bit of joy you can. Remember that we are given a great gift from God to enjoy all the good things He has created, and this should be celebrated. But also remember that this

freedom of ours should be made holy through the disciplines of Lent. As a Church we abstain from meat on Fridays in order to recall that Christ offered His Flesh and Blood for our life, and our own flesh often leads us to sin. We should all embrace additional prayer, fasting, and almsgiving in the season of Lent.

Finally, when the festivities have concluded, please join us on Tuesday night as we pray the second Chaplet of Divine Mercy of our Novena. The confessional will be open at 5PM for Shrove Tuesday, and then we will celebrate Mass and offer the Chaplet for all priest and religious. Fr. Miles Walsh will join us to offer the Mass and preach.

On Ash Wednesday we will offer Mass at 8AM, 12, and 6PM, with the distribution of ashes at each. I will be hearing confessions before each Mass. Starting this Friday and on every Friday of Lent we will pray the Stations of the Cross at 6PM. Our daily Mass schedule will not change – Tuesday at 6PM and Wed–Sat at 8AM (Divine Mercy after Tuesday Mass and community Rosary after Saturday Mass) – nor will our adoration schedule change – Tuesday 5PM, Wed–Fri 7AM, Saturday 3PM, and Sunday 8:30AM and 10:30AM. Make the best of the Lenten season by committing yourself to join us for extra times of prayer.
