

## From The Pastor's Desk

In Christ,

To all moms, happy Mother's Day! Thank you for your gifts of love, service, and guidance. It is most often you, our mothers, who teach us how to be faithful to Christ. We cannot help but remember in this the gift of St. Augustine's mother, St. Monica. While St. Augustine lived his early life away from the faith and in sin, his saintly mother never ceased to pray for him and have hope. Her example and prayer was fruitful when God rewarded her perseverance with his conversion. This was not only a great gift for St. Augustine who moved to sanctity, but for the Church as well because he became one of the greatest theologians in the history of Christianity. This example really shows not only the influence mothers have with their children, but even more so their responsibility. Moms have the responsibility of being examples of gentleness, prayer, humility, and hopefulness.

Consider the example of another saint, the most important of all: the Blessed Virgin Mary. She is the *Theotokos* – God Bearer, or Mother of God. Through her our Lord entered human life and history on His mission to save us. Her role, though, as Theotokos does not stop on Jesus' birthday, but continues throughout the history of the Church. She is always directing us to Her Son, and baring Him to us. As she says herself in the gospel of Luke, "My soul magnifies the Lord."

The Blessed Mother is not merely the mother of Jesus but the mother of all Christians. Remember Christ's words from the cross to His beloved disciple: "Behold your mother." But Mary is not the noisy and demanding mother who must be heard and seen. Rather she is the meek and humble servant who says, "I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." In this statement she allows Christ into the world, and continues to do so by directing all the faithful to Him. This is the perfect example of Christian femininity and motherhood. That is why Saint Pope John XXIII's words in his first encyclical are so true: "The mother should form her children firmly and graciously by the mildness of her manner and by her virtue."

In no way does any of this mean that a mother does not have authority over her child, but rather that her authority is one that begins with receptivity before dominance. This can be seen even in the very physical act of procreation. Motherhood is a self-sacrificial and life giving relationship. Even after birth this service of the mother continues. While this is a physical reality, more importantly is the spiritual reality. A mother should be concerned with the spiritual life of her children. That is why Mary is most important not because she was physically Jesus' mother, but because she was faithful. Remember our Lord's response to the acclamation, "Blessed is the womb that carried you and the breasts at which you

nursed." He replied, "Rather, blessed are those who hear the word of God and observe it."

This could also be related to another *kind* of mother we all have. We have our earthly mothers, our Blessed Mother, and finally we have our Ecclesial Mother – the Church. In his work *De Moribus Ecclesiae Catholicae* (*Of the Morals of the Catholic Church*) St Augustine says, "The Church is truly the mother of Christians." Her role, like all mothers, is to give us life (through baptism), to feed us (the Eucharist), to teach us the truth, to discipline us, and to orient us beyond herself to Jesus. And like other mothers one of the most important roles of her vocation is not merely to give us love, but to be an object of our love. Back in 2013 Pope Francis asked at a general audience, "Do we love the Church as we love our mothers, also taking into account her defects? All mothers have defects, we all have defects, but when we speak of our mother's defects we gloss over them, we love her as she is." Just as loving our earthly mothers gives us an identity and sometimes even purpose in life – keeping us from sin out of love for her – so too should it be with our mother the Church. Our love for her should give us identity and motivate us to be holy.

This is the great beauty of motherhood. You mothers have accepted and ushered the life of your child into the world physically. And more importantly, like St. Monica, Blessed Mary, and the Church, you continue to be life-giving through your example of prayerful obedience to the will of God.

Thank you. I commend you to our Lord through the humble and powerful prayer of Mary, the Mother of God.
